

It includes paintings, bronze and glass sculptures, photographers, makers of etchings and screenprints rubbing shoulders with cutting-edge digital graphics and concepts.

From van der Krol's fascinating

shots of life in pre-expansion Dubai to Henriette Dingemans and Sjoerd Bras's digitally created pieces, relations of their notorious public art pieces that can be found dotted about open spaces throughout the Netherlands, as well as a collection of 19th century sculpted models of the seven wonders of the world. 




Sabhan Adam ➤ April 30


The globe-trotting Dutch artist is in town with a collection of silk-screened, urgent and dynamic cityscapes, including dear old Dubal. Heat, flash and light.
